

Dual Display

A dual display is typically used for presentations. For this, the presenter uses a laptop or a classroom computer connected to an LCD projector. The method of choice is the presenter's view because it gives the presenter many options. In this view the audience sees the full screen slide show while the presenter can use his screen to view his outline, notes, calculate pricing, communicate with others, or even to obtain some on-line help. This also allows him to view upcoming slides and notes without advancing slides for the audience.

Normal View

1. In order to have the display the **same** on both the Monitor and on the projector (also called Mirroring or Cloning), right click on the Desktop screen, then highlight "Graphics Options".
2. Select "Output to"
3. Select "Intel (R) Dual Display Clone"
4. Select "Monitor + Digital Display"



Presenter's View

5. In order to have the projector image simply be an extension of the Desktop Screen, right click on the Desktop screen, and then highlight "Graphics Options".
6. Select "Output to"
7. Select "Extended Desktop"
