

Classical Europe

March 19-27, 2010

Summary:

This trip to Classical Europe will take participants to some of the most fascinating sites of the Ancient world. As we travel through Greece and Italy we will step back in time to relive significant events in the development of western civilization and the world of the New Testament. Led by Dr. Jim Bennett, we will explore Athens including the Acropolis and Mars Hill, walk ancient Corinth including the Agora and the Bema Seat of judgment, and venture through historic Rome to visit the forum, Coliseum, Pantheon, Vatican, and other famous sites. We will also visit Ostia to explore the workings of an ancient city before visiting Florence and the treasures contained in the capital of the Renaissance.

Trip Itinerary

Day One: Flight to Europe

We depart Green Bay for an overnight flight to Athens.

Day Two: Athens

Upon our arrival in Athens we will meet our tour guide and enjoy an orientation tour of Athens en route to our hotel. The remainder of the day will be free for exploring before we meet for dinner back in our hotel.

Day Three: Athens

We enjoy a full day tour of Athens to include an opportunity to view the Parthenon atop the Acropolis, Mars Hill, Hadrian's Arch, Parliament Building, the ancient Marketplace, the Stoa, Syntagma Square, and the first modern Olympic stadium. This evening will be free to explore the Plaka district and catch the sunset over the hills of Athens.

Day Four: Corinth/ Rome

After breakfast we depart Athens and travel to Corinth for a half day tour. We will have time to view the Corinth Canal before walking in Old Corinth. There we will explore ancient temples, the old marketplace, and the Bema Seat. Visit to archaeological museum is included. Later this afternoon we travel back to Athens for an evening flight to Rome. Upon our arrival in Rome we transfer to the hotel.

Day Five: Rome

We enjoy a full day tour of Rome to include a visit to the Roman Forum, Coliseum, Palatine Hill, Capitoline Hill, Circus Maximus, the Pantheon, Trevi Fountain, and more.

Day Six: Rome

After breakfast we enjoy a morning tour of the Vatican Museum, Sistine Chapel and St. Peter's Basilica. This afternoon is free to enjoy a group walking tour or explore Rome on our own. You may choose to see the ruins of Nero's Golden palace, visit the Baths of Caracalla, or walk the same steps where Martin Luther tried to make himself acceptable to God.

Day Seven: Rome/ Ostia

We depart Rome this morning and visit the Catacombs. This afternoon we will enjoy a guided tour of Ostia Antica before returning to our hotel for our dinner.

Day Eight: Florence

We begin our day with a morning tour of Florence. Our tour will include many treasures of the Renaissance period including the Ponte Vecchio, Santa Croce and the Duomo. This afternoon we drive through the Tuscan countryside on our way to overnight near Milan.

Day Nine: Depart for US

We depart Milan this morning and travel back to the US.
