The purpose of the Cross-Cultural Studies Department is to equip the student with the necessary linguistic, cultural, and communication skills to serve effectively throughout the world. This program stresses the authority of the Bible as the only basis for ministry, thereby sending a clear message that culture must never take precedence over Scripture. Students who study in these programs will receive rigorous academic training that will culminate in a cross-cultural internship. Each student will be individually mentored, counseled, and guided through the process of ministry field selection and development.

The Cross-Cultural Studies Department prepares the student for graduate studies, especially in other cultures. In addition, this program provides effective preparation for missionaries, ESL instructors, church planters, linguists, teachers of nationals, Bible translators, and creative access workers. Each emphasis is guided by dedicated faculty members who have proven themselves in the field.

Each student will be guided in an overseas cross-cultural education experience as a capstone to the training, and will receive TESL certification upon completion of all program requirements.
