The Department of Biblical Studies exists to train servant-leaders for vocational Christian ministry. The Bachelor of Arts degree in Biblical Studies prepares the student to think critically, to articulate effectively in written and oral form, to handle the Word of God properly, and to engage in sound theological study. The student will survey the entire English Bible, obtain a working knowledge of the Greek language, be exposed to the 10 major sections of systematic theology, receive instruction in exegesis, and acquire a basic understanding of the contemporary theological scene. Each student will be challenged to walk with God and to develop excellence in academics as a means to a lifetime of loving and serving God.

The Bachelor of Arts degree in Biblical Studies provides effective training for ministry in one of the following vocations: pastor, youth pastor, church planter, counselor, or evangelist. The program also provides sound preparation for graduate school or seminary. Each student will be guided and mentored by dedicated faculty members who have proven themselves in their respective fields of study.

### ***Bible Exposition Emphasis***

The purpose of the Bible exposition emphasis is to develop in each student the ability to accurately understand and apply the Word of God. In addition to 14 credits of Bible survey courses covering every book of the Bible, the student will choose 12 credits of Bible electives. Comprehensive study of the English Bible in addition to instruction in Greek, church history, homiletics, theology, and apologetics will prepare the student for local-church ministry or graduate work in seminary.
