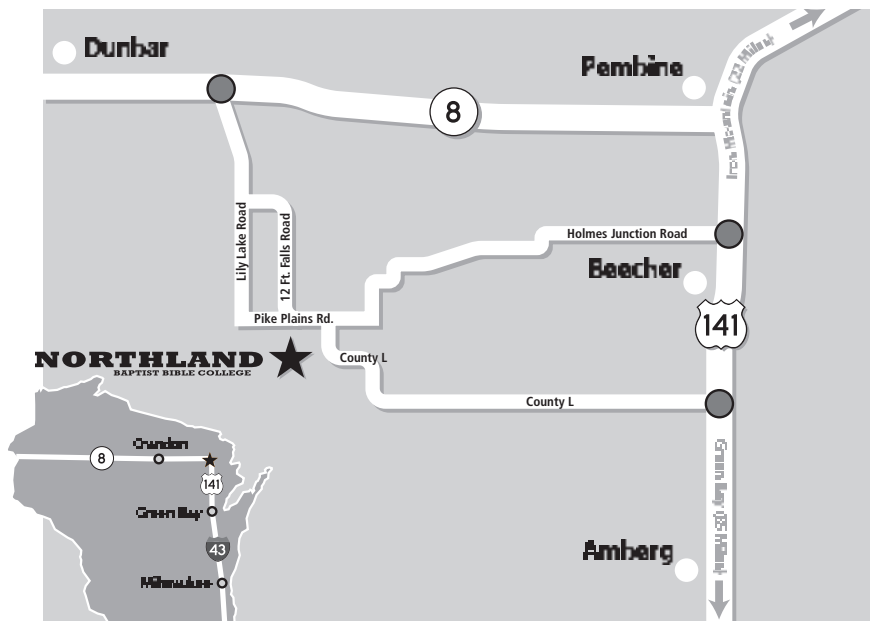

Directions to Campus

From Chicago

Take I-94 north to Milwaukee (2 hours). In Milwaukee, take I-43 north to Green Bay (2 hours). Take Highway 41/141 north and follow 141 toward Iron Mountain, Michigan (1.5 hours). Three miles past Amberg, Wisconsin, look for the Northland sign. Turn left (west) on County L. At the end of County L, turn left on Pike Plains Rd.

From Mackinac Bridge

Take Highway 2 west. Stay on Highway 2 until Norway, Wisconsin (about 3 hours). In Norway, go south on Highway 8 to Highway 141. Take Highway 141 south through Pembine (about 25 minutes). Turn right on County L. At the end of County L, turn left on Pike Plains Rd.

From Minneapolis

Take Highway 8 east to Dunbar, Wisconsin (6 hours). Three miles east of Dunbar, look for the Northland sign. Turn right (south) on Lily Lake Rd. Follow Lily Lake Rd. and signs to Pike Plains Rd. Turn left (east) on Pike Plains Rd.

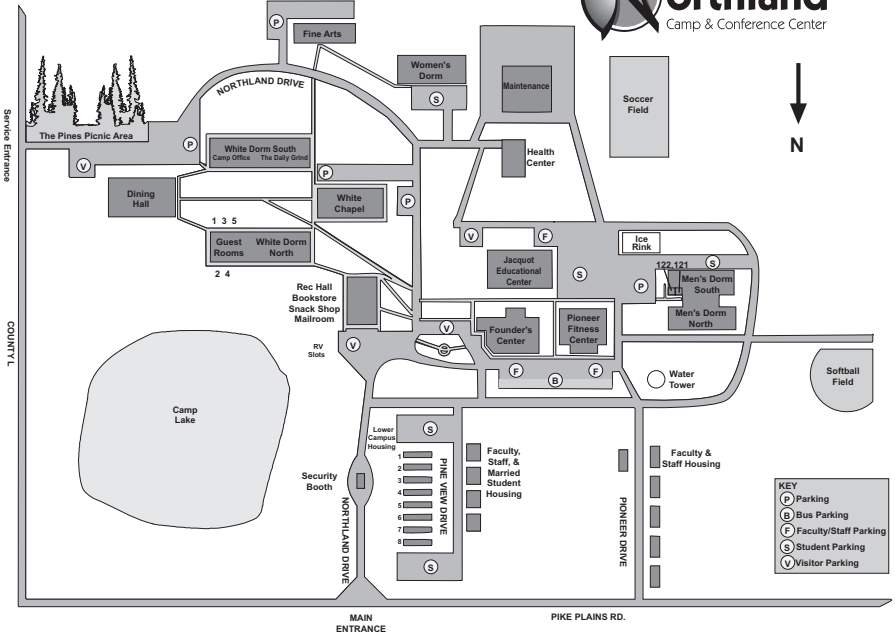

Appendix A

Financial Information

A goal of Northland Baptist Bible College is to serve students by offering a quality program at reasonable cost. We encourage students to seek financial counsel from the Business Office as soon as they are aware of a need.

Because a debt can be a snare that prohibits or hinders effective Christian service, Northland's policy is to limit the amount of debt a student may incur while enrolled in the college. This policy precludes the enrollment of students who are currently in debt and lack a detailed debt-retirement plan. Before they are allowed to enroll for another year, students must have all outstanding Northland bills current and be able to make their first full payment of the new school year.

Before transcripts or diplomas can be released, all college bills must be paid.

Insurance

Northland requires each student to have insurance coverage. If a student can provide proof of equal or better coverage with an outside carrier, he is not required to purchase Northland's insurance. If a student does not have insurance coverage or his outside coverage is less than Northland's, he is required to purchase insurance through Northland.

Method of Payment

Northland's billing cycle for the Student Account is divided into 10 payments each academic year, due on the fifth of each month, from August through May. The first payment of each semester is greater than the other four payments of the semester. A schedule of amounts due each payment date is available through the Business Office as well as on our website (www.nbbc.edu/Admissions/Financial-information). Any outstanding amounts due from prior years must be paid, as well as the first payment of the new year, before a student may enroll in classes. Even though a student may be working on campus to defray part of his expenses, the first payment must be paid in full. It is important that all accounts be paid on time and be kept current. During the school year, an interest charge will be applied to outstanding balances.

The Business Office sends a statement of account to students 10 to 12 days prior to the designated due date. Because a schedule of amounts due each payment is available through the Business Office, the statement is primarily an update of the

standing of the student's account, reflecting payments and financial aid received, Work Study credits applied, and other charges (such as phone bills) applied or received during the month.

When the bank returns a check unpaid, a returned check fee is applied to the student's school bill. If as many as two checks are returned by the bank unpaid, Northland will no longer accept personal checks from that student or patron.

Although Northland desires all students to have their accounts up-to-date before they take their final exams, students who are unable to pay their entire school account may take exams by signing a promissory agreement and taking full responsibility for all unpaid debts.

Refund Policy

If a student decides to withdraw from college prior to the end of a semester, the following applies. If, during the first 10 weeks of the semester, the student withdraws (except when called into military service), tuition is refunded based on his withdrawal date as noted in the schedule below. (Veterans, under Public Law 89-358, receive a refund on a daily prorated basis.)

If the account adjustment results in an outstanding balance still owed to the college, the outstanding balance is due immediately. For all withdrawals, tuition account adjustments are based on the student's last date of class attendance.

Upon receipt of written confirmation, students who submit payments before classes start but do not attend classes are eligible for a 100 percent refund, minus the required preregistration fee and allocated room and board costs.

When a student's status is changed to "withdrawn" and he owes money to the college, the money is due upon withdrawal. If payment is not received within 30 days, a late payment penalty of 1.5 percent per month (18% APR) is applied to the unpaid balance until it is paid in full.

Withdrawal:

Before the end of one week of classes	90%
Before the end of two weeks of classes	80%
Before the end of three weeks of classes	70%
Before the end of four weeks of classes	60%
Before the end of five weeks of classes	50%
Before the end of six weeks of classes	40%

Before the end of seven weeks of classes	30%
Before the end of eight weeks of classes	20%
Before the end of nine weeks of classes	10%

Note: Room and Board charges are prorated on a weekly basis from the first day of school and are based on the student's last day on campus. All other fees are nonrefundable.

All requests for or concerns about the refund policy should be made in writing to the Business Office Manager.

Explanation of Fees

Note: For current prices, please see the latest catalog supplement. If one is not inserted in your catalog, you may obtain one by contacting the Information Desk at (715) 324-6900, ext. 3000. You may also access current prices by visiting Northland's website (www.nbbc.edu).

Application Fee

An application fee must accompany each application for admission. After records are processed, the applicant is written regarding his acceptance. The nonrefundable application fee covers the cost of application processing.

Matriculation Fee

Required for all students each semester, the matriculation fee reserves class space for the applicant.

Student Benefit Fee

This nonrefundable, per-semester fee covers the costs incurred from fine arts dramas and concerts, extension ministries, athletic activities, ID cards, health fees, media resource fees, library use, Student Life services, and the annual yearbook fees. Any student who takes more than six credit hours is required to pay the full student benefit fee. Any student who takes six credit hours or less is required to pay half of the student benefit fee.

Tuition

A student may register for up to 18 semester hours without an overload charge to tuition. Any student who is permitted to enroll for more than 18 semester hours is charged for the additional hours at the current rate per credit hour. Part-time

students (taking 11 or fewer hours per semester) are also charged per credit hour. Dorm students are required to take a minimum of 12 hours.

Room and Board

Room and board is charged per semester for dormitory students and covers costs associated with meals and housing. Off-campus students may purchase meal plans at the Business Office or individual meals at the Dining Hall.

Graduation Fee

The graduation fee covers the cost of Commencement including the diploma and graduation regalia. The fee must be paid in full whether the degree is received in person or in absentia. The graduation fee is nonrefundable after March 1.

Vehicle Registration Fee

For safety and security reasons, all licensed vehicles must be registered on campus and will be assessed a yearly fee. Each vehicle must have adequate insurance and will be issued a decal with a unique NMI number.

Change of Schedule Fee

No charge is incurred for schedule adjustments during Drop/Add Week (first week of classes). After Drop/Add Week, students are charged a modest fee per course for schedule adjustments. Tuition is charged from the first day of classes.

Late Payment Fee

Payments are due in the Business Office on the fifth calendar day of each month during the school year, from August through May. Due to delays in mail processing, Northland grants a five-day grace period before applying late payment fees. Therefore, any payments received in the Business Office by the 10th calendar day of each month of the school year will be accepted as having been paid “on time.” Any payments received after the 10th calendar day of each month of the school year will be deemed late and are subject to a late payment fee.

Returned Check Fee

The Business Office charges \$25 for each check that is returned due to insufficient funds.

Late Registration Fee

A late registration fee is charged to students who fail to register for classes by 4 p.m. on registration day.

Late Check-in Fee

A late check-in fee is charged to students who fail to check in by the day and time designated by the Registrar's Office.

Class Fees

Students taking certain classes that have unique equipment, rooms, or consumable supplies are assessed a moderate fee to cover those special costs. A listing of those fees is inserted each year in the front of the catalog and is available to students who enroll on campus.

Miscellaneous Costs

Textbooks, supplies, laundry, and incidentals may cost anywhere from \$250 to \$500 per semester, depending on the individual student needs.

Other Services

Generally, the Business Office cashes personal checks up to \$100. Northland is unable to cash third-party checks.
